1) Approval of Minutes

A motion was made by Holster and seconded by Nowak to approve the July 19, 2013 minutes. Minutes approved and placed on file.

2) East Towne District Update – Nowak

The Family Community Block Party was a success. Volunteers for the event were greatly appreciated. A marketing plan and logo is moving forward. Officer Tao is working on a brochure for the East Town residents notifying them of future meetings to keep the communication moving throughout the neighborhood. The group is really doing well and have had a large number of participants at the monthly meetings.

They are hoping to hold a Clean-Up in their neighborhood during the National “Make a Difference Day” on Saturday, October 26th.

3) “Clean It Up, Wausau” event – Oct 5, 2013 8:00 am – 1:00 pm.

Schulz’s Recycling will participate instead of Weller’s Salvage this year. They will be sending their price fee breakdown for appliances and will get that to the Mayor’s Office for publication in the next City Newsletter. Goodwill Industries will be notified to ask if they are willing to participate this year. The Good News Project will participate and send a representative from their organization to the next N2N Meeting in September. They will not need volunteers from Attic this year as they have enough to assist from their own organization. A press release and advertising of this event will start in the first week of September.

4) Old/New Business

Dotter gave an update on the Pushback Campaign. They went to the last East Towne Neighborhood meeting and connected with neighbors. They have been the recipients of various local grants within the community and are utilizing the money for more pamphlets and advertising material. In September they will attend the Longfellow and Werle Park Neighborhood meetings. They will also walk the neighborhoods to continue to bring awareness of this issue to the forefront. A 3rd Press Conference will be held on September 10th and will focus on Addiction treatment and recovery.

Sue Nowak provided a written notice to the Mayor’s Office of her resignation from the N2N Committee and the East Towne Neighborhood Association work. The Mayor thanked her for her service.

A motion to adjourn was made by Kopp and seconded by Nowak. Motion passed and meeting adjourned.
