

## **PUBLIC HEALTH & SAFETY COMMITTEE**

### **Minutes of previous meeting(s). (11/18/13)**

Motion by Gisselman, second by Winters to approve the minutes of the previous meeting (11/18/13). Motion carried 5-0.

### **Consider various license applications.**

Rasmussen indicated there was one operator license application recommended for denial by Chief Hardel for Steven Salyers. It was noted that Steven Salyers was not present.

Rayala stated that she did leave a message for Mr. Salyers to attend the PH&S meeting if he would like to appeal the denial, however she did not speak to him directly.

Motion by Wagner, second by Kellbach to approve or deny the various licenses as recommended by staff. Motion carried 5-0.

### **Property Maintenance & Housing Code Violation Enforcement Report – Inspections (Bill Hebert)**

Hebert summarized the report of inspections recently completed and the follow up of those violations in November.

### **Discussion of immediate citations for certain property code violations**

Winters shared with the committee a memo and a listing of eight specific property code violations that he proposes receive immediate tickets rather than warning letters: Animal Sanitation, Boulevard Maintenance (Excluding grass too long), Equipment storage, Exterior Yard Maintenance (Excluding grass too long), Unapproved signs, trash containers, vehicle parking, grass too long.

There was discussion about changing the follow up of violations of long grass from the engineering department to the inspection department.

This subject will be revisited in January after further research and finding out what can be done as far as immediate citations.

### **Development of a program within the fire department to decrease the mortality of out of hospital cardiac arrest.**

Buchberger spoke of the improved survival rate of cardiac arrest patients in the city. Finke gave the specifics and a presentation of PulsePoint Application to decrease the mortality of out of hospital cardiac arrests. Buchberger explained that there is funding in their budget for this program.

### **Amend Section 9.24.070 Chronic nuisance premises-posting names of chronic nuisance landlords**

Motion to approve by Winters, second by Gisselman. Motion passed 5-0.

### **Create Section 5.64.034 Restriction on Servers – prohibiting a licensee from serving alcohol or supervising the service of alcohol while under the influence of an intoxicant, a controlled substance, a controlled substance analog or any combination of the foregoing**

Hardel supports a consequence to a server to refuse a P.B.T. Alfonso will research this further.

There was a suggestion to put on the application that the server must agree to take a P.B.T. if requested, or their license could be suspended or revoked.

Motion to approve by Winters, second by Gisselman. Motion passed 5-0.

### **Amend Section 1.01.025(c)(1)(B) Schedule of cash deposits to include sober server violations**

Motion to approve by Winters, second by Gisselman. Motion passed 5-0

**Amend Section 5.64.078(b) Point schedule to include sober server violations**

Motion to approve by Winters, second by Gisselman. Motion passed 5-0.

**Create Section 10.01.012 Use of Hand-held mobile telephones and mobile electronic devices while driving prohibited**

Alfonso said that the state statutes permit a person to use a GPS device if it is incorporated into the electrical system of the vehicle. She made it clear that when the city passes an ordinance, the ordinance cannot be contrary or conflict with state statutes.

Kellbach said that the county can't enforce something at their level. It has to be done through an ordinance at the municipality level to be enforced. The county is contacting the state (Senator Petrowski) about this ordinance / cell phone ban.

Winters proposed to table this issue until we hear more from other communities for further input. Rasmussen said that other communities were invited and could have put their input into this ordinance already. Wagner asked that the initial round table group meet again. Action will be deferred until the January PH&S meeting after another request to meet with all of the surrounding municipalities.

**Amend Section 10.32.020 Restrictions on permit – parades to permit waiver**

Motion to approve by Wagner, second by Gisselman. Motion passed 5-0
