Discussion and expression of concern for compliance issues at the VFW beer garden during the WI Valley Fair.

Chief Hardel stated we had some concerns last year during the fair because the VFW allowed individuals to leave their stand with beer. He felt they did not take that responsibility serious and when confronted denied that it was from their tent even though it was witnessed by an officer. Hardel stated he had requested they obtain independent security for this year's fair, but it was not supported by the committee. There were meetings with the VFW and officers for this year, who came away with the impression that the VFW would hire security and the Fair Board also thought they would hire security; however, they did not.

Hardel stated the Police Department conducted a compliance check sending in underage individuals to the VFW tent as well as all of the other beer tents at the fair. He noted they were informed in advance there was to be a compliance check and explained they had to check IDs. The VFW sold to the underage person upon the first compliance check and officers met with them the next day to advise them they failed and that we would be checking again. The next night the second check was done and they failed again. He had the same concerns as last year that they do not take the responsibility serious and recommended the committee not allow them to have a picnic license for next year. If the committee chooses to grant them one he requested they mandate that they hire security.

Jack Pettit, VFW Post Commander, and Roger Sydow, Chairman for the VFW for the fair were present. Sydow commented on last year stating he did not deny the incident and the person at the gate was removed at that time. Hiring guards was discussed with the committee last year, but his understanding of the requirements was to meet with police in the spring of the year, which was done with Cpt Barnes. He stated we were to provide our security plan and at that time we had contacted a security company as backup in the event our plan was not approved. He changed the guards for this year and attempted to schedule them appropriately and he thought this was acceptable. He acknowledged they were informed that the compliance checks were going to be done and the entire process was explained to them. Signs were also placed as requested and he thought they had complied with the committees requests for this year. He commented he had no explanation for the compliance failures under the circumstances, but it was one individual both times, which wasn't even one of our members. He indicated the individual was removed and there were no further incidents. He commented they do take this very seriously.

Rasmussen stated the issue is that it keeps happening at the fair as well as at the VFW Lounge, showing a pattern of behavior. She noted the other two organizations at the fair use private security and wristbands and they pass these compliance checks. She questioned why there was an issue with hiring private security. Sydow indicated the main issue was the cost of approximately \$20 per hour.

Rasmussen stated it was not necessary to take action for the 2016 fair tonight; we had it on the agenda for discussion and to express our concerns. The committee will consider requiring private security for next year and they could impose that contingency in the spring when the picnic license comes before us for approval. Wagner suggested they bring their plan in writing to the meeting in the spring along with their picnic license application. Rasmussen recommended he meet with the police department on this plan before it comes to committee. Pettit ensured the committee there will be some changes.

On behalf of the Wausau Urban Community Gardens, a project of Bridge Community Health Clinic, 1810 North 2nd Street, Wausau, I would like to ask that the following request be considered at your March 21st Public Health and Safety Committee meeting.

As beekeeping permit holders in good standing for two years, we respectfully request a waiver that will allow us to operate three colonies of bees at the Bridge Clinic garden site. This would be accomplished by adding one colony to the two existing colonies and removing the two colonies at the Emerging Garden site, located on the south side of Bridge Street. The net effect is moving from 4 colonies at two locations to three colonies at one location.

The reasons for this request include:

- There have been no reported concerns or problem with any of the colonies by garden users.
- There are no residential neighbors to south, west, or north sides of the Bridge Clinic garden site.
- Currently, operating two separate hive locations is inconvenient for our volunteers, as we utilize the same equipment for both hives.
- After a year of utilizing the wooden fence enclosure at the Emerging Garden site, we have learned that this prevented proper air circulation and restricted sun exposure. Both colonies at the Emerging Garden site died. We do not plan to introduce a new hive at the Emerging Garden site until a solution can be determined that both increases the success of a colony at that site and maintains the safety and health of the gardeners. We have removed the equipment from the property.
- As a result of losing two hives, we wish to install one additional beehive at the Bridge Clinic location.

We have been operating in compliance with the beekeeping ordinance with a certified beekeeper who was involved with our beekeeping project last year and is an employee of Bridge Clinic. In order to improve our program, we have enlisted two experienced beekeepers for mentoring and guidance. A new volunteer beekeeper and I will be attending a beekeeping workshop and conference this month for further education and certification.


