### **Minutes of previous meeting(s). (11/21/16)**

Motion by Peckham, second by McElhaney to approve the minutes of the previous meetings (11/21/16). Motion carried 5-0.

### **Consider various license applications**

Rasmussen noted there were no denial recommendations this month. Wausau Events 2017 special event applications were included on the list, as well as various license renewals.

Motion by Wagner, second by Kellbach to approve the licenses as recommended. Motion carried 5-0.

### **Update from CCITC and Wausau PD on replacement of Tiburon software system.**

Gerald Klein updated the committee through a PowerPoint presentation on how they selected the software system. (*Presentation in committee packet online.*)

### **Discussion and possible action on adoption of guidelines/policy related to issuance of Operator's Licenses (Bartender's Licenses).**

Rasmussen stated historically for the last six or more years applicants recommended for denial have had the option to come before the committee and the council to appeal. We have not had an actual process for the appeal and it can be daunting for individuals to pour out their stories in front of the committee and audience. She indicated Alfonso researched the law as to what it takes to legally possess a license and/or to deny one. The goal was to come up with a consistent appeal policy which lays out the criteria the chief has been using for his denial recommendations.

Alfonso stated the issuance of alcohol related licenses is governed by state statute; there are provisions in the statutes that set forth specific requirements for holding licenses. She pointed out in the statutes it states individuals may not be a convicted felon where the circumstances of the conviction are substantially related to the activity/job. They also may not be a habitual offender where the offenses are substantially related to the job. She stated we should not be giving licenses out to people who have felony convictions substantially related and the only exception is where a person has received a pardon by the Governor. She noted our policy has been OWI and drug convictions are substantially related. She went into more detail regarding the statutes and similar case law.

Rasmussen felt there has been some confusion on the criteria for denial and although the chief, clerk's office and the committee know what it is, it has not been published where the public, employers and the council can see it. Chief Hardel agreed the criteria needs to be publicly accessible instead of just telling individuals verbally. Rasmussen commented too many times decisions to overturn a denial recommendation have been made on an emotional basis. If they have a felony conviction that is substantially related to the activities of bartending the state statutes says they cannot legally hold a bartender's license.

Peckham felt we need to continue to legitimately hear an appeal of a denial when someone feels their life situation has changed and he did not see that the form proposed provided that option. Rasmussen stated we can consider overturning a recommendation where there is a record of misdemeanor convictions and the individual can convince the committee of a direction change, but not with substantially related felony convictions unless there was a pardon. Neal commented they should be careful not go too broad in what they consider substantially related and become too restrictive. Peckham requested they amend the appeal form by adding a check box that states: "I believe the felony I have been convicted of is not substantially related to the service of alcohol beverages and is not contained within the policy as previously published." *Discussion followed.* Peckham also asked for a checkbox with the word "other" and "attach separate sheet if needed."

Motion by Wagner, second by McElhaney to approve the policy and add the two revisions to the appeal form as stated above. Motion carried 5-0.

**Operations Report from Fire Department for November 2016**

**Tavern Activities / Compliance Checks / Law Enforcement Activities**

Hardel presented the Tavern Report for November 7, 2016 through December 4, 2016 (*See attached*)

Hardel commented the committee had requested that they keep track of bartenders that have repeated violations. He indicated that Lt. Mike Felder now has a spreadsheet that he keeps with the bar report and anytime a bartender is cited, he enters the name into the spreadsheet. In the event a bartender has multiple violations of selling to underage individuals, this can be considered as a reason for non-renewal of the Operator's License.

**SUBJECT:** Discussion on LSL Replacements within the City of Wausau

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PH&S Committee,

The Wausau Waterworks Commission has discussed the need for Lead Service Line (LSL) Replacement within the City and has recently been looking at possibly preparing a policy/mandate to require property owners to replace the private side LSL. At the last Commission meeting it was suggested that we reach out and provide information to other Committees formally and provide some background and answer any questions as well as get some feedback on the initiative being discussed.

Wausau Waterworks has been educating the public on LSL's and lead in water for a number of years. This has typically been through their newsletter, city newsletter and more recently through the media. As many of you may know we have approximately 6,000 LSL's on the city side (water service line from the main to the curb stop/property line) and over 10,000 private side LSL's (water service line from the curb stop to the water meter). The city is responsible for the city side LSL and we have been replacing these in conjunction with our street reconstruction projects, during leak repairs and break repairs, and during sewer service line repairs/replacements.

Background on the raw water and the treatment the City uses. Our raw water is supplied from groundwater wells, it is treated mainly for removal and iron & manganese but also treated to reduce corrosiveness. Water is naturally corrosive and because lead is a soft metal it is easily broken down if the water is not properly treated. There is NO lead naturally occurring in the groundwater. Lead enters the water in the distribution system based on its corrosivity. Through the treatment process and prior to pumping the water to the distribution system the pH of the water is raised and sodium silicate is added which significantly reduces the interaction of the water with the piping minimizing lead leaching into the water. The city is in compliance and below all lead action limits imposed through regulation.

Testing requirements: Currently we are on a 3-yr testing cycle for Lead. We need to test 30 sites every 3 years, the WDNR selects the sites where we need to test. These are all Tier 1 sites, residential properties with identified LSL's.

The US EPA initiated a two year program in 2016 that would provide funding to states for private side LSL replacement. Wausau has received \$300,000 for 2017 and unofficially received \$300,000 for 2018. The WDNR will be providing these funds as forgivable loans to municipalities. The Waterworks Commission has approved the process of expending these funds in conjunction with our Street projects this year. In addition, the Commission has approved the replacement of all day care facilities with lead service lines. The day care's will be funded at 100% with these funds and residents private side LSL's will be funded up an amount of \$1,500 each. To give some perspective related to the funding provided compared to what is required for replacement of all LSL's:

1. Total Funding from WDNR - \$600,000
2. Funding Required - \$30,000,000 (to replace all LSL's within on Wausau's Distribution System)

This discussion is just the beginning of bringing awareness and more education to the LSL concerns. It would be good to receive feedback from other committees and council members regarding setting a policy for mandating private side LSL replacement and if there would be support for the City paying a portion of the costs. Green Bay implemented a program like this but they had only about 1,500 LSL's in the ground. Milwaukee just recently approved a policy mandating the replacement and the City would pay for a portion of the work. Menasha voted down a mandate policy. These are just a couple of examples from around the state and we can continue to gather this information. Based on the "White Paper" published by the US EPA related to the Lead and Copper Rule (LCR), it included some language that encouraged entities to begin looking at replacing LSL's private side and non-private side. Typically when these "white papers" encourage these things it means the US EPA is considering making some future regulation requiring this to be done. We do expect a change in the LCR to be presented and possibly implemented in 2018.


