Minutes from the December 7, 2015 Meeting

We had a great turnout for our annual holiday meeting. We shared good food, good company and wishes for a wonderful holiday season. The following information was also imparted:

1. Anne let us know that the Wausau Fire Department still has smoke detectors. You can receive up to 3 detectors and the Fire Department will install them, if requested. If interested, you may contact Anne (715-845-4148) or Dave DeSantis (715-261-7904).
2. Romey also had several items us:
 - He announced he has definitely decided to run again for the District 2 alderperson position.
 - Residents will have the option of getting smaller garbage containers 90 days after the new program takes effect. The containers with blue lids are for garbage; the ones with green lids are for recycling.
3. Officer Nate Stetzer distributed and discussed the December issue of The Briefing Sheet.
 - The Wausau Police Department uses several styles of policing, including community oriented policing which includes a great deal of interaction with the community.
 - The first “coffee with a cop” went very well with approximately 40 attendees. There is another event scheduled in January at Bigby’s.
 - There are multiple ways to be involved with the Police Department including: “coffee with a cop”; explorer groups; emergency police (applications are available at the Police Department, the City website under the Police Department tab or by contacting Nate), and the ride along program.
 - Medications placed in the drug drop (located inside the Safety Building) have the labels removed so there is no way to track who donated them. Drugs are removed from the containers they were in and are sent to the State of Wisconsin for disposal by incineration.
 - All information Nate includes The Briefing Sheet can be found at www.crimereports.com. Nate also talked about the Police Department looking at a new tracking program that would make gathering statistics for publications (like The Briefing Sheet), etc.
