Minutes from the June 2, 2014 Meeting

1. Betty Noel manages Riverview Towers (for Community Development) and led our tour of the facility. The Towers were built in 1969; all apartments were completely renovated in October, 2013 (no local tax money was used) with a grand opening scheduled for June 20, 2014. We toured the model apartment and received information on residency eligibility and rules. Each unit is unfurnished one bedroom apartment (a stove, refrigerator and microwave are included; washers and dryers are available on several floors. Residents must be at least 55 years old or disabled. Minimum rent is \$50 per month (based on 30% of your adjusted gross income) and includes heat, light and water. Units are non-smoking and 1 cat and/or 1 small dog are allowed. Forty-two (42) garage spots are available at no additional cost; additional outdoor parking spaces are available. A library, computer center, fitness center, dining hall and on-site store (Tuesdays only from 1:00-2:00 PM) are available. A noon meal is offered Monday through Friday (suggested donation is \$3.30); building residency is not required to attend the meal.
2. Romey had several items for us. This is his last term as alderperson (he encouraged anyone in the district who is interested to run for the seat). He also said he will release all information he legally

can on the result of current investigations and other issues of interest to City residents. He discussed the support the City has given the Wausau Center Mall.

3. Our next meeting is scheduled for Monday, July 7th.
