Minutes from the July 7, 2014 Meeting

1. Officer Max LaPorte, a member of the Community Resource Officers (CRO), spoke to us about their job duties. Officer Laporte explained they are a small unit that currently spends most of their time working on drug cases (drug houses are scattered throughout the City, not just in specific areas). Their duties also include investigating prostitution, blight, property and neighbor issues. They have executed a large number of search warrants for marijuana, heroin, methamphetamines and ecstasy.
2. Officer Laporte also answered various questions regarding housing for people accused/convicted of a crime. He discussed what a TLP (Temporary Living Place) is and the very strict rules their residents must follow. The objective of a TLP is to transition parolees back into society; TLP's currently have no permanent staff to monitor residents. Officer LaPorte also explained that drug arrests can be found on CCAP after the accused makes their first court appearance.
3. Tammy Stratz from Community Development spoke to us about neighborhood/block grant money. There will be a planning meeting to discuss where funds can/should be used within the City. The funds must benefit all members of a neighborhood but particularly those within certain income limits. A "neighborhood" is not necessarily defined as the same geographic area as those of neighborhood groups.
4. Our next meeting is scheduled for September 8th, the second Monday, since September 1st is Labor Day.
