Minutes from the October 5, 2015 Meeting

1. Those in attendance discussed numerous topics:
 - There has been quite a bit of activity (lots of cars, people in and out in a short period of time) in the 800 block of Henrietta.
 - Prospect Avenue seems very narrow when cars are parked on both sides of the street, especially since it is the alternate route for Grand Avenue.
 - Anne will be attending the next Parking and Safety Committee meeting to request “no parking here to corner” signs on specific intersections in our neighborhood and parking on only 1 side of the street during Bull Falls events.
 - Overnight odd/even parking is now allowed year round (the 12/1-3/31 overnight parking restrictions no longer apply). A question was asked regarding why the change was made.
 - If the snow plows miss your street, contact the Department of Public Works (715-261-6960) to have them come and clean it. Please wait long enough to be sure it was truly missed but not so long that it becomes a real problem.
2. Romey had several items for the group:
 - Everyone will initially receive the large trash containers but will be able to switch to a smaller one after 90 days if they wish to (this will allow a reasonable amount of time to determine what the correct size container is for you). The new system is expected to save the City as much as \$800,000.
3. Spring Clean-Up Options were discussed. Some other communities have had success with service groups/organizations (Boy Scouts, United Way, etc.) picking up large items. The group then takes the items to a central location where people can go through the items and take what they want/can use. The remainder is then disposed of.
4. Amy Arlen (Wausau School District) spoke to us about some changes being considered for Hawthorne Hills Elementary School. The School District is working with the Wausau Police Department to design separate drop-off/pick-up areas for cars and buses to reduce congestion during peak times.

Our next meeting is scheduled for Monday, November 2, 2015.
