



July 19, 2016

The meeting was called to order by Ruth Griswold.

Attendees introduced themselves by name and street location.

The minutes of the June 21, 2016 meeting were approved as printed.

Ruth Griswold, Treasurer, reported a balance of \$131.20.

Officer Nate Stetzer reviewed the Briefing Sheet. The City of Wausau Parks was the featured item of the Briefing Sheet. In addition to the printed comments Nate said there have been issues with people being in the parks after 11:00 PM, alcohol in the parks, and failure of people to clean up after themselves and their dogs.

Nate is creating a neighborhood call system Nexcel Code: Text WausauPD to 88877. He will explain more about this at a future meeting.

Working on drug problems in Wausau has kept Nate busy. Some drug sellers have been taken off the streets. The community will be hearing more details of this later.

There has been counterfeit money on the streets. Four persons have been arrested for this.

Questions raised by attendees.

Is there an ordinance in Wausau for playing loud and or profane music?

Answer: There is no time noise or profane words ordinance in Wausau. If there is a problem call the police.

Is the police department getting co-operation from other jurisdictions on the drug traffic problem?

Answer: Information is shared with other jurisdictions and agencies.

What is done with drugs that have been confiscated?

Answer: They are destroyed by the state. Some is kept for K9 training. (Wausau now has three K9s)

Can confiscated drug money be used for purchasing new K9s?

Answer: Some can be.

Does anyone know more about the development of the Kwik Trip on Sixth Avenue?

Answer: No information available.

Any information available on the Save O Supply building?

Answer: No

How are police going to handle all the problems that might be created with the River Front District, the drinking that will be moved from the 400 Block to other areas and other nuisance areas with the resources that are available?

Answer: A committee has been formed to study the issue.

Has use been started with the police body cameras?

Answer: Yes.

The Forest Park Neighborhood Picnic is September 20th, 5:30 to 8:00 PM at Sylvan Park.

Help is requested for setting up and clean up. Family activities will be available.



WHAT YOU SHOULD KNOW

Burglary: A known suspect had broken into a residence in the 1300 block of North 5th Street and had stolen money.

Garage Break-Ins: There were approximately 15 garage break-in's on the southwest side and the north east side of town. A male was arrested for numerous break-ins and a search warrant was preformed on his residence.




