Open bids and make recommendation for the 2016 Pavement Marking Project

The following quotations were received and opened:

Brickline, Inc.	\$114,873.45
Century Fence Co.	\$158,408.95

Discussion followed on the budget. Lindman moved to award the contract to the low-qualified bidder, Brickline, Inc., in the amount of \$114,873.45 pending a budget modification. Jacobson seconded and the motion passed.

Open quotations for 2017 Police Squad Upfitting

The following quotations were received and opened:

Low Voltage Solutions	\$33,410.83
General Communications	\$33,340.00

Jacobson moved to approve the quotation received from Low Voltage Solutions in the amount of \$33,410.83 contingent upon review of the quotations. Groat seconded and the motion passed.

Make recommendation for the purchase of two Police Interceptors for the Police Department. (Quotations were opened August 30, 2016.)

and

Make recommendation for the purchase of a half-ton 4WD pickup truck for the Police Department. (Quotations were opened August 30, 2016.)

Hanson explained that quotes for 2 utility vehicles and one pickup truck were reviewed. Kocourek Ford and Scaffidi Motors were the only vendors able to quote both. Brickner and Fred Mueller provided quotes for the pickup truck, which were higher than the quotes submitted by Kocourek and Scaffidi. Scaffidi was a few hundred dollars lower with a quote of \$32,022.50 for the pickup and \$58,287 for the utility vehicles for a total of \$90,309.50. Kocourek submitted a quote of \$32,363 for the pickup and \$59,321 for the utility vehicles for a total of \$91,684. Although Scaffidi is a few hundred dollars lower, Hanson recommends accepting the quotes from Kocourek as they are local. Jacobson suggested asking Kocourek if they would match Scaffidi's quotes. Hanson added that the City has a good working

relationship with Kocourek and the service department has gone over and above to help with issues on vehicles.

Groat moved to accept the quotations submitted by Kocourek for a total of \$91,684, with Hanson to ask Kocourek if they would be willing to meet the price difference. Lindman seconded and the motion passed.
