**Approve minutes of the June 30, 2020 meeting**

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Groat moved to approve the minutes of the June 30<sup>th</sup> meeting. Jacobson seconded and the motion passed.

**Open bids and make recommendation for 2020 1<sup>st</sup> Street Riverlife Trail**

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The following bids were received and opened:

Groat moved to award the contract to the low-qualified bidder, Haas Sons, Inc., in the amount of \$299,065.37. Jacobson seconded and the motion passed.

**Open Request for Proposals for 2020 Mowing Services**

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The following proposal was received and opened:

Mohelnitzky indicated the costs provided per hour went up \$5.00 from last year and the site visit went down \$5.00. Groat moved to accept the proposal from Baumann Lawn Care & Landscaping. Wesolowski seconded and the motion passed.

**Make recommendation for the purchase of six 2021 Utility Police Interceptors (Quotations were opened June 30, 2020.)**

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Hanson provided a summary of the quotations submitted. Scaffidi submitted the lowest quotation in the amount of \$233,550, Ewald was the second lowest in the amount of \$243,258, and Kocourek the highest with \$244,311.78. There were differences with options, but Hanson was able to add up the costs for a grand total. He noted that they have dealt with Kocourek in the past and they are a local dealer. He would prefer to deal with Kocourek. Groat questioned if the warranty would be taken and Hanson confirmed.

While recognizing that Kocourek is local, Groat moved to accept the low proposal from Scaffidi Motors in the amount of \$233,550. Jacobson seconded and the motion passed.

**Discussion and possible action on the purchase of asphalt from two vendors**

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Quotes from RC Pavers and American Asphalt were included in the packet. Mohelnitzky explained that for a vast

number of years purchase orders have been kept open for both vendors. RC Pavers is a little higher on fines and American Asphalt is higher on surface. The mileage to RC Pavers is 4.6 miles; whereas American is 10 miles. With travel distance, equipment and labor it is quite a bit lower to go to RC. RC is also a little more receptive to our needs of fines. A lot of times if American Asphalt has a highway project going on, they will not have fines that day. On the other hand, RC Pavers is a smaller company and may not run all 5 days. Then we would have to go to American Asphalt. The recommendation in 2015 was to use both vendors. This item was brought up again to verify why we are using two vendors and keeping both purchase orders open.

Groat moved to approve continuing contracts with both vendors. Wesolowski seconded and the motion passed.

**Industrial Park Lift Station Rehabilitation Project: August Winter & Sons, Inc., Pay Estimate #1**

This pay request was reviewed by Clark Dietz. Wesolowski moved to approve Pay Estimate #1 in the amount of \$197,600. Groat seconded and the motion passed.

**2020 Street Construction Project A: Haas Sons, Inc., Pay Estimate #2**

This pay request was reviewed by Nicksich and the project inspector. Wesolowski moved to approve Pay Estimate #2 in the amount of \$360,985.28. Groat seconded and the motion passed.

**Portland Cement Concrete License: Norcon Corporation**

Jacobson moved to approve the subject license. Wesolowski seconded and the motion passed.

Jacobson moved to adjourn the meeting. Seconded by Wesolowski. Meeting adjourned at approximately 11:15 a.m.
