1) Approval of Minutes

A motion was made by Holster and seconded by Prey to approve the 8/10/18 meeting minutes. Motion passed.

2) Clean It up, Wausau - Fall Event

A spreadsheet of the costs was distributed by the Public Works Department. Costs are creeping up as the years continue; however, we are offering this service more each year. We offered it through the summer months and this fall event was very, very busy. It is predominantly run by DPW staff and not volunteers anymore which also accounts for the increase cost. It still remains lower than the curb-side pick-up. Discussion took place about the need to assist the elderly residents in transporting their possessions. This will remain on our radar as we go through the winter months. DPW suggested that they reach out to the Neighborhood leaders as a resource when a resident calls and is unable to get her items to the waste site. Groeschel will send DPW a list of the Neighborhood leaders for their file.

3) Neighborhood Association Updates

Riverview Neighborhood - Carlos thanked the Mayor and city staff for attending their last meeting. It was very informative to have them there to answer questions from the group. Excessive speeding remains a large issue within their neighborhood. They understand that the Police Department has priority issues and this isn't one of them. PD will try to monitor the situation more. It was asked if radar could be done with the cameras. It cannot. Can speed bumps be put in? Traffic calming ideas were discussed.

East Towne Neighborhood - Their Block Party held in September was a success. At their last meeting they had a guest speaker from North Central Health Care.

Athletic Park Neighborhood - Representatives from the YMCA came to their last meeting and explained the new expansion they will be doing. Their attendance has been high.

5) Old/New Business

Mayor Mielke stated that he is always assessable. DPW stated they attended the East Towne Block Party and provided a back-hoe and other large equipment for the kids to climb on. The next N2N Meeting will be December 14, 2018.

A motion to adjourn was made by Prey and seconded by Diny. Motion passed. Meeting adjourned at 8:12 a.m.
