## **PUBLIC HEALTH & SAFETY COMMITTEE**

### **Minutes of previous meeting(s). (12/19/16)**

Motion by Peckham, second by Kellbach to approve the minutes of the previous meeting on 12/19/16. Motion carried 5-0.

### **Update on automated refuse and recycling collection system and discussion on feedback from service provider, residents and alderpersons**

Maryanne Groat stated the DNR has a minimum standard of how much recyclables should be collected each year, which is part of our reporting for an annual grant of \$150,000. She indicated we have never met those minimum standards in the 20 plus years she has been working for the city. Since this new recycling program has been implemented recycling has gone up approximately 40% and we now meet those minimum standards.

Andy Gayhart, Harter's, commented he felt things were going well now that they have learned the system for the city. He stated substitute or fill-in drivers on routes sometimes have missed streets, but we just put on a second Operations Manager for the company which will help. Committee comments, questions and answers followed regarding complaints, overfilled carts, spilled contents, toppled carts, etc.

Wagner felt now that we have a year in, we need to encourage people to change out the size of their containers or get a second one, if needed, now that they know their usage. Rasmussen suggested putting a column in the spring newsletter with the top five do's and don'ts with regard to the new system.

### **Update and discussion on status of public and private side lead water service lines from Public Works & Utilities Director**

Eric Lindman stated the Wausau Water Works Commission requested he bring this information forward. The US EPA had allocated some grant funding to states, depending on the size of the municipality, and Wausau is going to receive \$300,000 in 2017 and possibly another \$300,000 in 2018 for private side lead service line replacement. He explained these funds are going to be distributed by the DNR through their Safe Drinking Water Loan Program. He indicated he has requested those funds and 2017 has been guaranteed and 2018 will also most likely be, so we will have a total of \$600,000. He indicated the commission priority was to replace the lead service lines at all the daycares that have known lead service lines and would fund those at 100%. The remaining funds would be used in conjunction with our street construction projects. The city would replace the city side service line and these funds, up to \$1500 per home, would be used to fund the private side. He noted we would need permission from the homeowner and if it is going to cost more than that the homeowner would pay the additional cost.

Lindman stated the US EPA is coming down with additional regulations at some point, possibly in 2018 or more than likely 2019, on the lead and copper rule. Typically when they do this they send out a white paper which tells what their intentions are moving forward. It is not regulation, it is recommendation, and right now they are pushing heavily to mandate that the private side lead service lines be replaced and to have municipalities require that. There will be a cost and we have grant funding for 2017 and 2018, but will probably look at implementing something in 2018 to begin in 2019. It will have to be set up within our ordinances and policies. He noted currently the water utility also has a no interest loan program for people that want to replace their lead service line. He indicated he would keep this committee up to date because city wide this going to have significant impact on the residents. He stated the water utility is regulated by the Public Service Commission; we cannot use the water user rates to pay for the private side lead service replacement, so if the city wants to put a mandated program in place and help fund this, it would have to come out of the general levy.

### **Consider request for waiver of the fence requirement for Apiary (Beekeeper) Permit at the Wausau Airport - Angela Uhl/Wausau Flying Service, Inc.**

Rasmussen stated this was discussed at the Airport Committee and since the airport is completely fenced in there does not seem to be a need for the residential fence requirement.

Motion by Peckham, second by Kellbach to waive the fence requirement for the Apiary Permit (Angela Uhl/Wausau Flying Service, Inc.) at the Wausau Airport. Motion carried 5-0.

**Consider various license applications**

Rasmussen stated there were no denials this month.

There are two new special events submitted by the Wausau River District, Open Streets Wausau and Jazz on the River. Elizabeth Field was present to answer questions regarding the events. Peckham questioned what streets would be closed for Open Streets Wausau. Field indicated they wish to close 3<sup>rd</sup> Street from the mall to the Woodchuck's stadium, as well as a portion of Washington Street from 1<sup>st</sup> to 3<sup>rd</sup> Street. The consensus was for Ms. Field to work with the PD regarding street closure and traffic. Wagner suggested she report back after a couple of these new events have been tried as to their success.

Kellbach questioned the status of the items marked pending on the list. Goede stated the Operators have all been approved, however, the new Pet Fancier applications marked pending were still pending approval of the Humane Officer. She indicated the committee would be approving those licenses contingent upon the Humane Officer review and any denial recommendations would be brought back to the committee.

Motion by Peckham, second by Kellbach to approve or deny licenses as recommended by staff. Motion carried 5-0.

**Operations Report from Fire Department for December 2016**

No comments. Report placed on file.

**Tavern Activities / Compliance Checks / Law Enforcement Activities**

Hardel presented the Tavern Report for December 5, 2016 through January 2, 2017. (*See attached*)

Wagner questioned what was going on at Mountain Lanes due to the numerous entries on the Tavern Activities Report. Chief Hardel indicated they have been in regular contact with the owner. There was a transition that needed to occur when she took over and he asked the committee to give her some time. He noted they had a very large crowd on New Year's Eve an officer reported there was significant staff on hand; all of age persons were wrist-banded; underage were separated and supervised by staff. Peckham questioned if the burglar alarm was fixed at Mountain Lanes, as there were six responses to the alarm on the report and Hardel indicated the owner told him it has been fixed.

COMMENTS ON PROPOSED AMENDMENT TO  
W.M.C. SECTION 5.72.010, QUALIFICATIONS  
RELATING TO TAXI CAB PERMITS

- Recently an individual applied for a taxi cab permit, however, the applicant, having moved from out of state, had not yet obtained a Wisconsin driver's license.
- The Clerk's Office inquired whether a valid Wisconsin driver's license should be a requirement for obtaining a taxi cab permit, and the Chief of Police indicated that it would be a prudent requirement.
- Accordingly, a provision making a valid Class D Wisconsin driver's license a requirement for a taxi cab permit is proposed for inclusion into the ordinance.

Section 1. That Section 5.72.100 Qualifications, is hereby amended to read as follows:

5.72.100 Qualifications.

Such permit shall not be granted to any person under the age of eighteen years or to any person who has been convicted by a court of competent jurisdiction for any offense involving moral turpitude of for driving a motor vehicle as a conveyance of persons for hire while under the influence of intoxicating liquor, or other controlled substance, while such conviction remains of record and is not reversed; provided, however, that a permit to a person within such prohibited class may be granted under such circumstances within the discretion and upon approval of the chief of police for good cause shown where more than five years have elapsed from the date of expiration of sentence, except as to persons convicted of rape, murder, manslaughter or sex offenses. A person shall not be issued a permit unless he or she currently holds a valid Class D Wisconsin driver's license.

Section 2. All ordinances or parts of ordinances in conflict herewith are hereby repealed.

Section 3. This ordinance shall be in full force and effect from and after its date of publication.


