PUBLIC HEALTH & SAFETY COMMITTEE

Minutes of the previous meeting(s) (3/20/17 & 4/17/17)

Motion by Peckham, second by Kellbach to approve the minutes of previous meetings. (3/20/2017 & 4/17/17).

Motion carried 5-0.

Consider request of the Wausau Eagles Club to hold three outdoor summer events in their fenced in ball diamond on the property.

Goede explained the three events requested are to be on the Eagles Club property within the fenced in ball park area: Man-of-Honor Society Community Raffle (including fireworks), June 9-11, 2017; Kayak weekend, July 28-29, 2017; and Eagles Corn Roast, August 12, 2017. They will have a tent for beer with wrist banding; and bands, with music to end by 10:00 pm.

Motion by Wagner, second by Peckham to approve all three events at the Eagles Club. Motion carried 5-0.

Consider various license applications, including the 2017-2018 liquor license renewals.

Goede pointed out the deadline for Operator License renewals was today by 4:30 pm., therefore, the list in their packets was incomplete. She requested they approve all the renewals contingent upon the Police Chief's review and approval. She noted any that were subsequently denied would be given the opportunity to appear at the next meeting.

Rasmussen indicated there were denial recommendations for Debra Mielke (Operator) and Andrew Prokudowicz (Taxi Driver). It was noted that neither individual was present.

Motion by Kellbach, second by Peckham to approve or deny the applications as recommended by staff and/or to approve pending applications contingent upon internal review. Motion carried 5-0.

Request to reconsider denial of Public Transport Diver License (April Cherry)

Goede indicated Ms. Cherry called the previous week to inquire if her request for reconsideration of the denial was on the agenda as she had requested and she was told that it was. The Public Transport Driver license has already been denied by the Council. It was noted April Cherry was not present to appeal. No action was taken.

Discussion and possible action regarding extension to be open for business - Crostini Bar (Third Peak Hospitality, LLC)

Troy Davis explained the bar was fully operational, however, the individual who was to handle the food operations withdrew from his position due to family reasons. He indicated they discussed opening just the bar portion of the business, but learned through social media there was a strong desire of potential guests to have both the food and drink concept at the same time. He requested a 30 day extension for the public opening to get the food portion operational. He stated they intend to start holding private events, so they will be conducting business in a limited way.

Rasmussen questioned if he was confident they could be open to the public within 30 days, which would be June 15th, and Davis responded that he was. She felt the committee could not extend any further if it did not open.

Motion by Kellbach, second by Peckham to approve a 30 day extension to June 15, 2017. Motion carried 5-0.

Consider Central Business District Obstruction Permit - Sweets on 3rd

Rasmussen stated Sweets on 3rd has applied to place a sandwich board sign on the sidewalk for the purpose of advertising ice cream. She noted a number of 3rd Street businesses already have these signs.

Motion by Wagner, second by McElhaney to approve the Obstruction Permit for Sweets on 3rd. Motion carried 5-0.

Formal Expression of Concern - M & R Station, 818 South 3rd Ave (Richard Gordon)

Rasmussen explained the reason the owners, Richard and Mary Gordon, were called in before the committee was because the establishment has accumulated 100 demerit points based on a recent event. She questioned if they were willing to discuss that event tonight.

Alfonso clarified that if there was discussion tonight and there were to subsequently be a suspension or revocation hearing, anything said here could be used against them at that hearing.

Rick Gordon pointed out the 100 demerit points were from one incident. He commented what happened was a terrible thing and the person was a very good friend of theirs, as well as an employee. He indicated she worked that evening from 3:00 – 6:00 pm., had two drinks there afterwards and left at about 7:30 pm. He stated he received a call from his bartender around 10:30 or 10:45 pm., that she was back and sleeping at the bar. He came down and checked on her and thought about calling an ambulance, but did not because the people she was with said they all did a lot of shots. He noted she was breathing and snoring and thought she was just asleep. He indicated he has helped her home on other occasions and so he gave her a ride home and when he last saw her she was sleeping on her couch. He stated from now on he will always call an ambulance if this situation ever happens again.

Rasmussen stated when someone is unconscious in your establishment, you have a duty to keep those patrons safe. Gordon agreed and noted they provide many safe rides home for patrons and that this is the only incident they have had at their bar. Rasmussen stated someone died as a result of your inaction which is far more serious than fights or overserving. Gordon indicated he did not dispute that he should have called an ambulance.

Cpt. Baeten stated he understood that Mr. Gordon was upstairs and did not know what had happened prior to coming down, but his employees were accountable to him, so it calls into question the safety of the patrons. Rasmussen was concerned about what level of safety exists for persons incapacitated and unable to make that judgement for themselves. She felt they needed to have some type of remediation plan and to tell them what is going to change in the management going forward. She indicated the committee could consider a short term suspension.

Mary Gordon stated they have 16 security cameras and gave the footage to the detectives immediately. She noted their daughter is a Paramedic EMT Firefighter and they have discussed things with her. She felt they were ready for any situation that may arise going forward.

Wagner stated he would like to see some training of their staff that is documented and which could happen during a short suspension. Rasmussen stated if the committee wants to have a short term suspension, they would have to hold a hearing at which both sides can testify and present evidence. Wagner felt they should move forward with the hearing to have all the facts and both sides presented. He commented they may possibly decide at that time not to suspend.

Alfonso pointed out there would need to be a complaint filed by a citizen of the City of Wausau in order to proceed with a hearing. If a complaint is filed the hearing would have to proceed whether they were in support of it or not. Wagner questioned if a hearing could be avoided if the owners agreed to a voluntary suspension. Rick Gordon stated that was something they could talk about and get back to them on. Rasmussen suggested they get back to either Attorney Alfonso or the Police Chief.

Operations Report from Fire Department for April 2017

Wagner questioned the status of the Community Paramedic Program. Chief Kujawa stated we are closing out our pilot program and still working on getting the final report for it. *Discussion followed.* Report placed on file.

Tavern Activities / Compliance Checks / Law Enforcement Activities

Baeten presented the Tavern Report for April 4, 2017 through May 3, 2017. (*See attached*)

Wagner questioned the status of the police relationship with Mountain Lanes Family Fun Center and if the owner should be invited to appear before the committee, because it seems like every month there are more troubling reports. Baeten commented in our direct conversations with the owner there is courtesy and an expression of understanding, however, there is continued activity and an increase in disorderly activity after hours on the property. Baeten indicated he would like to confer with Chief Hardel before inviting the owner to appear because he was not aware if the chief may have had any previous conversations with her.

Discussion and possible action regarding Ordinance Creating Section 8.08.012 Keeping of Chickens

Rasmussen stated there are a lot of communities that have taken up this issue and found a way to make it work within a controlled environment. She indicated Attorney Alfonso researched these communities regarding their permitting process and guidelines.

Alfonso explained the proposed ordinance is pretty straight forward; an individual would need to complete an application for a permit and register with the Department of Agriculture, Trade & Consumer Protection as a livestock premises. There is a late fee if chickens are obtained before getting a permit or if the permit process is not followed. The limit is four (4) chickens or less; only hens, no roosters allowed; permitted on R1, R2 or R3 zoned residential property; cannot slaughter chickens within the city limits; must have a coop; chickens must be inside the coop in the evenings (sunset to sunrise); a run must be attached to the coop for the daytime; coop cannot be closer than 10 feet to a property line or closer than 25 feet to a principal residential structure; there is a minimum size for the coops; no commercial activity or selling of the eggs or fertilizer; must dispose of waste in an appropriate manner; and the other provisions of our animal code would apply.

Rasmussen noted the Humane Officer will do an initial inspection of the site to ensure compliance with the ordinance, but would not re-inspect every year. The permit can be revoked if there are problems with complaints or inhumane treatment. Alfonso stated the permit fee would be \$35 and a violation of the ordinance would be \$187.

Wagner questioned if our only option was to take chickens to the Humane Society if someone were found to have too many. Humane Officer Ashlee Bishop stated the chickens would be accepted at the Humane Society because they would fall under our stray non-dog contract, which means \$185 per chicken. She indicated she would work with the individual to educate them and give them time to get rid of the number over the limit before going that route.

Nicole May addressed the committee to speak on the key benefits of chickens, namely a cheap source of highly nutritious food; sustainable and environmentally friendly; they eat many undesirable insects, as well as noxious weeds; manure can be composted; and they can be fed kitchen scraps, reducing waste. She addressed arguments against urban chickens, such as noise, however no roosters are allowed and the noise level of hens is lower decibels than dogs and lawn mowers. She encouraged approval of the ordinance.

Motion by Wagner, second by Peckham to approve the ordinance creating section 8.08.012 Keeping of Chickens. Motion carried 5-0.

Discussion and possible action regarding Amending Section 8.08.125 Restriction on animals other than dogs and cats, Section 8.08.190 Animals not to run at large, Section 8.08.270 Penalty, Section 1.01.025(c)(1)(B) Schedule of cash deposits to include keeping of chickens; and the Resolution authorizing the addition of fees to the City of Wausau Fees and Licenses Schedule adopted pursuant to Wausau Municipal Code §3.40.010(a).

Motion by Wagner, second by Peckham to approve the ordinance amending sections of the animal chapter related to the keeping of chickens; and to approve the resolution to add the fees to the schedule. Motion carried 5-0.

COMMENTS ON PROPOSED ORDINANCE
CREATING W.M.C. SECTION 5.62.045, SPECIAL YOUTH VENDING LICENSE

- A local citizen has expressed interest in having their minor child obtain a vending license in order to conduct a domestic/home style type of business selling ice cream from a bicycle vending unit this summer. The citizen expressed some concern about being able to obtain a license for this activity as the City's vending ordinance provides in W.M.C. s. 5.62.040(c) that "[a]ll applicants must be at least 18 years of age."
- While this provision of the ordinance would not prohibit a minor from operating a small entrepreneurial business of the type described, someone 18 years or older such as a parent or legal guardian would need to be the applicant and license holder and the minor would conduct the business under that permit. In other words, the ordinance as written does not require the minor to be 18 in order to sell products from a vending unit, but that the applicant for the license be an adult over the age of 18.
- Certain provisions of the current ordinance, however, likely make it more difficult for a youth to operate an entrepreneurial type of enterprise over the "summer." This office has been requested to create an amendment to the present vending license scheme for consideration by the Committee and Common Council to permit a special youth vending license geared toward youth operating small "summer" vending businesses.
- The accompanying proposed ordinance creates such a "special youth vending license" which is unencumbered by certain provisions of the "regular" license and limits the scope of an operation which may be conducted by a minor holding such a special license.
- The highlights of the proposed ordinance are as follows:
 - ✓ A parent or legal guardian would be required to be a co-applicant for the license. A license would be issued in the name of both the parent or legal guardian and the minor.
 - ✓ The parent or legal guardian would be required to assume all liability for the activities of the minor and the vending operation.
 - ✓ The parent or legal guardian would be required to indemnify the City from liability which might arise in connection with the operation of the business and obtain personal liability insurance in a minimum amount of \$100,000.00 and name the City as an additional insured. (The "regular" license requires insurance in an amount of \$1,000,000.00).
 - ✓ No youth vendor may be under the age of 12 (this mirrors the requirements of federal and state laws governing the employment of minors).
 - ✓ The application fee will be \$15.00. A license would be limited to the time period of April 1 through September 30. (The fee for a "regular" license is \$100.00 per year or \$75.00 for half a year.)

- ✓ Numerous state and federal laws govern the employment of minors. The ordinance references the responsibility of the parent or legal guardian to ensure compliance with any such law which might be applicable to the operation of the particular youth vending business.
- ✓ In order to avoid any potential conflict with state labor laws, the ordinance limits the operation of the minor's vending in accordance with the provisions of Wis. Stat. s. 103.68, hours of labor which states in relevant part:

103.68 Hours of labor. Except as the department may from time to time issue orders as provided under s. 103.66(2) regulating the hours of employment of minors, the following schedule of hours shall be deemed to be necessary to protect minors from employment dangerous or prejudicial to their life, health, safety, or welfare and shall apply to minors of the ages specified therein:

(1) No minor may be employed or permitted to work at any gainful occupation during such hours as the minor is required under s. 118.15 to attend school.

(2) No minor under 16 years of age may be employed or permitted to work in any gainful occupation, other than in domestic service, farm labor, or public exhibitions, as provided in s. 103.78, as follows:

(a) For more than 3 hours on a school day or 8 hours on a nonschool day.

(b) For more than 18 hours in a school week or 40 hours in a nonschool week.

(c) For more than 6 days in a week.

(d) Before 7:00 a.m. or after 7:00 p.m. from the day after Labor Day to May 31.

(e) Before 7:00 a.m. or after 9:00 p.m. from June 1 to Labor Day.

- ✓ The parent or guardian is responsible for any violation of the ordinance relating to the special youth vending license.
- ✓ Vending under the special youth vending license would be limited to residential areas. No vending would be allowed on the 400 Block or during a Special Event that might be held in a residential area.
- ✓ The holder of the special youth vending license is required to comply with certain provisions applicable to holders of a "regular license" such as noise levels, keeping areas clean, limitation on size of vending unit and the like.
- ✓ Minors using bicycles in the operation of their business would be permitted to ride that bicycle on the sidewalk when vending. This is an exception to the general prohibition that bicycles are to be ridden in the street.
- ✓ No license of any type is required under the circumstances set forth in W.M.C. s. 5.62.030 which covers situations such as a child's lemonade stand at a private

residence, the sale of individually wrapped, sealed food items prepared by licensed processors such as Girl Scout Cookies or Boy Scout Popcorn, these activities being exempt from vending licenses altogether.

- As an ordinance clean up matter, subsection (g) of W.M.C. s. 5.62.040 relating to the 20 license limitation on regular licenses would be repealed.

5.62.045 Special Youth Vending License.

(a) Purpose. The City desires to encourage the entrepreneurial spirit in City youth interested in creating their own unique opportunities for economic success and thereby promote work and marketplace skills in its young citizens. To this end the City desires to create a special youth vending license which is unencumbered by certain provisions relevant to the operation of large scale mobile vending units and vendors within the City limits, but is also limited in scope appropriate to youth vendors. The provisions of this section are not intended to permit the employment of minors in circumvention or violation of any state or federal law, including but not limited to the provisions of Wis. Stat. s. 103.64 through 103.83, and WI Admin Code, DWD 270. The provisions of this section are also not intended to permit larger scale mobile vending units and vendors who would otherwise be required to obtain a mobile vending license under the provisions of this chapter to avoid obtaining a regular license.

(b) Application. An application for a special youth vending license shall be submitted jointly by the minor and the parent or legal guardian of the minor on a form provided by the city clerk which provides the name, address, telephone number and date of birth of the applicants, a photograph or drawing of the mobile vending unit, if any, a description of the product(s) to be vended and a copy of a current State of Wisconsin or health department license for the vending of any food items. No minor applicant may be under the age of twelve (12). The application shall be signed by the parent or legal guardian and shall provide that the parent or guardian assumes all liability for the activities of the minor and the vending operations and further indemnifies the City in accordance with the provisions of Section 5.62.040(d). A special youth vending license may be approved and issued by the City Clerk upon compliance with the requirements of this section and issued in the name of the parent or legal guardian and the minor.

(c) Insurance. The parent or legal guardian shall have in force adequate personal liability insurance in an amount of not less than \$100,000.00 and shall comply with all other provisions of Section 5.62.040(d).

(d) Fee. The applicants shall pay an application fee as set forth in section 3.40.010(a).

(e) Term. The license shall be issued for a period from April 1 through September 30.

(f) License.

and (1) A special youth vending license shall only permit a youth vendor to vend and operate in residential areas. No vending under a special youth vending license shall be permitted on the 400 Block or during an approved Special Event under the city's Special Events Policy Procedures where the Special Event has been approved within a residential area.

(2) A special youth vending license shall only permit the sale of food or beverage items that are individually wrapped and sealed and prepared and packaged by a licensed processor, or goods, wares, or merchandise.

(3) A special youth vending license shall permit a youth vendor who is vending products from a bicycle to operate the bicycle on city sidewalks while engaged in the activity of vending notwithstanding the provisions of Section 10.40.050 of this Code.

(4) A youth vendor shall be permitted to vend only during those times and hours as provided by Wis. Stat. s. 103.68 and WI Admin Code, DWD 270.11.

103.21(1) (5) A youth vendor engaged in vending under the terms set forth in Wis. Stat. s. shall obtain any necessary permit that may be required by Wis. Stat. s. 103.25.

(6) The parent or legal guardian of a youth vending under a special youth vending license shall be responsible and liable for ensuring compliance with any applicable state or federal law governing the employment of minors, including but not limited to any applicable provisions of Wis. Stat. s. 103.64 through 103.83, and WI Admin Code, DWD 270.

(7) The holder of a special youth vending license shall comply with the provisions of Section 5.62.060(b) through (r), (u) and (v) applicable to mobile vendors generally.

(8) No vending under a special youth vending license shall be permitted to occur from a motor vehicle or other on-street unit.

(9) The parent or legal guardian shall be responsible for any violation of this section and subject to the penalties of section 5.62.100. A special youth vending license may also be subject to suspension, revocation or non-renewal in accordance with section 5.62.050.



RE: M & R Station Tavern Voluntarily Surrenders Liquor License for Seven Days Reference Incident that Occurred on 02/22/2017

I have had extensive discussions with Rick Gordon over the past few days to discuss the incident that occurred on 02/22/2017, where a patron was passed out at the bar and eventually was taken home and died of a drug overdose. Rick has stated numerous times that the behavior that the patron displayed was normal behavior for her. This patron and her husband are family friends with Rick Gordon and his wife and frequent M & R Station regularly. Rick states that the patron has fallen asleep often while in his tavern and then wakes up and continues to consume alcohol.

Rick stated he understands his responsibility as a tavern owner, which in part, includes the protection of his patrons and the responsibility to provide assistance to them when necessary. Rick apologized for his lack of awareness to the medical situation and stated he will provide training to all his staff so they can recognize situations like this and take the appropriate action. Rick also stated that he now has Narcan in his bar so that he can be more prepared should a similar event occur.

I should also note that Rick voluntarily turned over all security video from his establishment to WPD after this incident occurred which prevented the additional time it takes our investigators to prepare for a warrant.

I feel that Rick has taken responsibility for M & R Station's lack of action and I feel the seven day voluntary suspension is appropriate and satisfies the City's desire to ensure our tavern owners are responsive and accountable. M & R Station will be closed from May 25-31, 2017.
