### **Minutes of the previous meeting(s) (9/18/17)**

Motion by Peckham, second by Kellbach to approve the minutes of previous meeting. (9/18/17). Motion carried 4-0.

### **Consider various license applications**

Rasmussen stated the following Operator Licenses were recommended for denial: Dustin Georgeson and Anthony Zelenka; and Public Transport Driver Licenses recommended for denial: Shelbie Klopp, Bobbie Jo Roth, Michael Kratwell, Dale Ware.

Dustin Georgeson appealed to the committee acknowledging he has a record but was trying to get away from that lifestyle by moving to Wausau. He indicated he currently has an Operator's license in Schofield and has never had any issues bartending. Rasmussen stated they looked at the totality of the record, which includes three OWI convictions. Georgeson stated he really has only two because the on last one he did not have much alcohol, but he was under absolute sobriety, so they charged him with a third. It was noted Anthony Zelenka was not present.

Shelbie Klopp and Bobbie Jo Roth were not present. Michael Kratwell stated he did not know why he was denied, as the letter did not specify. Chief Hardel stated it was a lengthy record including two felony convictions, one which was felony OWI. Kratwell responded that the things on his record were old and that he had a Taxi Driver license in 2002 – 2005. Rasmussen commented there were five OWI's, so the totality of the record is the concern. Kratwell stated he quit drinking and this was the only job he could do because of two hip replacements and a knee replacement.

Dale Ware stated his letter did not specify the reason for denial. He stated everything in his record was true, but he hasn't had anything new on it for the last three, maybe four years. He indicated has been out of prison for almost three years and is off probation. He stated the only recent things were speeding, no insurance and a seatbelt ticket. Rasmussen pointed out a THC possession conviction in July 2017. Ware stated he was pulled over for something else and in a search of the vehicle they found marijuana seeds, not the drug itself, and he was unaware of the charge and conviction.

Rasmussen stated the Liquor License Review Subcommittee recommended the regular Class B Beer & Liquor license be awarded to Mid State LLC, dba, La Taqueria Restaurant.

Motion by Peckham, second by Kellbach to approve or deny licenses as recommended. Motion carried 4-0.

### **Request for waiver of regarding chicken coop dimensions and secondary additional coop cage. (William Forbes, 1515 Forest Valley Road)**

Ashlee Bishop explained the reason she approve the waiver for this particular residence is because of the size of the property and the other houses are actually quite a distance away. There is a large section of the neighbor's yard that would also be a nice barrier, as well as foliage.

Motion by McElhaney, second by Kellbach to approve the waiver. Motion carried 4-0.

### **Consider Central Business District Obstruction Permit (306 S 1st Ave - Wausau River District)**

*This item was withdrawn as it was not needed.*

### **Consider Central Business District Obstruction Permit (4th Street & Washington - Imaginar Adventures LLC)**

Rachel Davis, Imaginar Adventures, LLC, explained this request is just for the next two weekends and Halloween. She noted the only thing that will actually be on the sidewalk are the small sawhorse signs.

Motion by Kellbach, second by Peckham to approve the Obstruction Permit. Motion carried 4-0.

**Discussion and possible action regarding an Ordinance Creating Chapter 5.73 Commercial Quadricycle Licensing**

Dan Dadabo and Ashley Sampson were present regarding their business plan for a quadricycle. Dadabo felt the proposed ordinance would allow them to run a successful business. Alfonso stated one of the things we would expect is that the patron is not bringing on 36 ounces every time the vehicle has a stop. Dadabo agreed to make the 36 ounces per person the limit for the duration of the trip.

Dadabo indicated that they have consulted with the Police Department on the routes. Rasmussen questioned if there was music on board and Dadabo confirmed there was a stereo on the bike which will be kept to a reasonable volume. Rasmussen summarized the ordinance covers all of the things they had talked about in terms of regulations of pedal pubs, including a pre-approved route, licensing of the owner, limited hours of operation of 10AM – 10:30PM, conditions for safe loading and unloading, permits a carryon of not more than 36 ounces of fermented beverage, not serving on the pub, no glass containers, and requires insurance.

Chief Hardel indicated he recently discussed this at a law enforcement meeting with two other municipalities present that have pedal pubs (Madison and Milwaukee). One of the issues they brought up was noise from people talking and yelling. He commented he felt Dadabo and Sampson were responsible people and had a well thought out plan, but he still had some concerns with people running and trying to jump on, people leaving bars with open intoxicants to get on, and individuals leaving the pedal pub with open intoxicants and going into a bar. There could also be possibilities with liability with people falling off because of intoxication. Alfonso noted she add a prohibition that no passenger can disembark from a quadricycle while it is in motion and if an officer sees this, they could also cite the person.

Consensus was the fee would be the same as a Public Transport Business at \$200 per year and drivers \$50. Discussion took place regarding the license year start and end dates to be determined by the Clerk's Office.

Motion by Peckham, second by Kellbach to approve the ordinance creating commercial quadricycle licensing. Motion carried 4-0.

**Discussion and possible action amending Section 8.08.010(d)(3) Certain creatures forbidden related to sale of poultry at a market place**

Alfonso explained this is to allow the Clerk's Office to issue the permit administratively, as are done with the other permits once staff inspects and approves them.

Motion by Peckham, second by McElhaney to approve the amendment. Motion carried 4-0.

**Tavern Activities / Compliance Checks / Law Enforcement Activities**

Hardel presented the Tavern Report for September 4, 2017 through October 3, 2017. *(See attached)*

Hardel commented they were still investigating the shooting that occurred at Roc's Place which was not complete because the parties are not being very cooperative, nor were the employees of Roc's Place. He noted this was similar to what occurred at Its Our Clubhouse, where individuals were shooting at each other. There were bullet holes found in vehicles and we are fortunate that no one was hurt. *Report placed on file.*

**HEARING: Dustin Truax, owner, appeal of prohibited dangerous animal declaration - Blue**

Rasmussen opened the hearing, however, it was noted that Dustin Truax was not present to appeal. Ashlee Bishop indicated that she informed them that someone needed to appear. Rasmussen stated the appeal of prohibited dangerous animal is then presumed denied. Bishop noted the dog has already been relocated to Rhinelander and they only appealed so that they would be able to bring it back into the city for occasional visits.

The Common Council of the City of Wausau do ordain as follows:

Section 1.       That Section 5.64.150 Enclosure required—Picnic licenses, is hereby amended to read as follows:

(a)       The license holder of a special temporary Class “B” ~~fermented malt beverage (picnic) beer~~ license (~~picnic license~~) or a special temporary “Class B” (picnic) wine license shall cause to be installed around the main point of sale a fence or fences at least seven feet in height measured from ground level, or two fences at least four feet high and eight feet apart, in order to control ingress and egress of persons and consumption of fermented malt beverages or wine; and shall station an adult at the entrance to the area for the purpose of checking age identification. The herein described fence regulations shall not apply to a licensed area within an enclosed building, Athletic Park, The 400 Block, Isle of Ferns Park, or the Wausau Downtown Airport.

(b)       No fermented malt beverage or wine shall be served to or consumed by anyone outside of the fenced-in area.

(c)       All license holders issued a special temporary Class “B” ~~fermented malt beverage (picnic) beer~~ license (~~picnic license~~) or a special temporary “Class B” (picnic) wine license shall post in a conspicuous location at the main point of sale and at all entrances to the facility a sufficient number of signs disclosing that no fermented malt beverage or wine shall be served to any underage person.

Section 2.       All ordinances or parts of ordinances in conflict herewith are hereby repealed.

Section 3.       This ordinance shall be in full force and effect on the day after its publication.



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**NOTABLE INCIDENTS AT TAVERNS TO WHICH POLICE WERE DISPATCHED.**

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**El Jalapeno's, 300 N. 3<sup>rd</sup> Street**

- (1) *Event #170120987, 10/14/17 at 1:50 AM:* Officer was driving through the area when he observed a disturbance outside the bar. After the investigation into the activity, it was determined that the disturbance was a group of people that were restraining a male that had been causing problems in the bar, and was kicked out. No one at the scene wanted any charges pressed, and there were no other victims that would come forward. The male was released at the scene with the admonition not to return to the bar.
- (2) *Event #17012840, 10/22/17 at 3:02 PM:* An anonymous call was received at the Lieutenant's office, in reference to employees that are underage and drinking when they are done with work. The caller mentioned an employee that was going to be there on 10/28/17, wearing a costume. Since the caller remained anonymous, I (Lt. Felder) responded to the bar on 10/27/17, and made contact with a manager. We spoke about the complaint. He assured me that he has only one worker that was underage, and that he keeps very close tabs on that kind of activity. He invited the Department to come check them if we wanted to.
- (3) *Event #170128098, 10/30/17 at 1:57 PM:* A female called to report that she suspect that her drink had been spiked with something after having been at the bar. An Officer questioned her, and learned that she had been to several other locations as well, and could not actually determine where it may have happened between the different bars. The Officer contacted the bar and spoke with the owner, Angela. She felt that she had adequate staffing to assure that everyone was safe, but would go over the importance of vigilance with her staff.



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**Glass Hat Bar, 1203 N. 3<sup>rd</sup> Street**

- (1) *Case #17-12002, 10/14/17 at 2:26 AM:* Officers were conducting an extra patrol in the back parking lot of the bar after closing time. They found a male that was urinating outside. He was issued a citation for Disorderly Conduct.
- (2) *Case #17-12424, 10/22/17 at 1:51 AM:* **A bar employee** called to report a fight involving ten people. Officers responded and made contact with all parties involved. The victims related that they were outside the bar (in the parking lot smoking a cigarette) when approached by four males. An argument and fight ensued. A bouncer also came out and tried breaking up the fight, but was not successful until he yelled that the Police were coming. The four males left in two cars, but were stopped by responding Officers as they were leaving. - (1) *Event #170120972, 10/14/17 at 12:49 AM:* A complainant who refused to be identified called to report a man yelling at a woman, and they were refusing to leave. Officers responded and located the couple outside, about a half-block away from the bar. They both admitted to verbally arguing, but that they would separate for now and work things out later.
- (2) *Event #170121669, 10/15/17 at 7:22 PM:* A caller listed as “Chief” called to report having been “assaulted” at the bar. He claimed he was shoved out of the bar and onto the floor by white males. Officers responded and learned that a male named “Keith” came into the bar and tried to instigate a fight with an employee of the bar. The other employee did not respond to Keith, and other patrons confronted Keith. Keith then left the bar on his own accord. Officers noted that Keith was very intoxicated; however he was never served at Intermission. They wanted Keith to be aware that he was no longer allowed in the bar.
- (3) *Case #17-12418, 10/21/17 at 11:07 PM:* **A bar employee** called to report that there was a man that had punched a woman with his fist and slamming her onto the ground outside the bar. He fled the scene and was not located. A report was completed, referring the male for Substantial Battery and Disorderly Conduct. The male has yet to be located.



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**Limerick's Public House**, 121 Scott Street

- (1) *Case #17-0117957, 10/06/17 at 11:24 PM:* A **bar employee** called to report that there was a male passed out at the bar, and he was unable to be awakened. Officers and an ambulance responded. On arrival, the male was conscious, alert, walking and talking. He refused medical treatment and wanted to walk home. He was allowed to leave on his own recognizance.
- (2) *Event #170129684, 11/02/17 at 9:13 PM:* A **bar employee** called to report that a woman had passed out at the bar. Officers and an ambulance responded. The main Officer decided that the incident was a medical call only, as the woman suffered from fainting spells and was diabetic.

- (1) *Case #17-12423, 10/22/17 at 12:50 AM:* A **bar employee** called to report a fight involving an unknown number of people in the middle of the bar. Officers responded and were able to make contact with two people that appeared to have been involved, based on the fact that one had a cut lip. The one with the cut lip stated he was punched by another male, whom he did not know. No suspect was identified.
- (2) *Event #170124682, 10/22/17 at 2:18 AM:* Dispatch received several calls, including one from a **bar employee**, reporting a large fight outside and behind the bar. This is the second separate report of a fight the same evening. Officers responded and found a large crowd behind the bar. They located one male that had blood on his shirt, but he claimed it was from his friend's nose. He was no longer on scene. No one was able to point out anyone actively involved in the fight, and there were no victims that were present to file a complaint. The Officers remained on scene and had the crowd disperse.

Officers responded and learned that there had been an argument and bar employees were concerned that it was going to become more. The offending people had left prior to Officers’ arrival. No Law Enforcement action was taken.
- (5) *Case #17-13077, 11/05/17 at 1:28 AM:* Officers were driving by and observed a male outside the back of the bar urinating. He was issued a citation for Disorderly Conduct.

NOTE: Yer Vang, Christine’s owner had a conversation with me during one of the extra patrols that were conducted at the bar. She was highly concerned about recent events at the bar, with recent fights and the upcoming Hmong New Year. She stated that since Mountain Lanes had closed, a bad element has started coming to Christine’s. She expressed a fear for the safety of her normal customers, and welcomed all Law Enforcement extra patrol and walk-throughs. She also inquired about having an off-duty Officer work as security at the bar. The request was submitted, but it was short-notice, and no Officers signed up for the detail. She remains committed to working with the Police.

**Eagle’s Club, 1703 S. 3<sup>rd</sup> Avenue**

- (1) *Event #17-13084, 11/05/17 at 9:02 AM:* Bar owner called to report that a soda machine was broken into the night before. The investigation is ongoing, pending review of surveillance video.

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**Roc's Place**, 810 S. 3<sup>rd</sup> Avenue

- (1) *Case #17-11616, 10/06/17 at 1:30 AM:* Three separate calls were received reporting gunshots fired outside the bar. One of the calls was from a **bar employee**. Officers were in the process of doing a walk-through when the call came in, and observed some of the aftermath, however, no one was discovered to have been injured, and the suspects involved were not identified. A suspect vehicle was stopped shortly after the incident; however the occupants denied involvement and were arrested on non-related drug charges. The City has received your appeal of an Order of the City of Wausau Police Chief Jeffrey Hardel concerning your dog, Joker

**Your appeal is set for a hearing before the Public Health & Safety Committee on Monday, November 20, 2017 at 5:30 p.m. in the City Hall, Council Chambers.**

**Please note the time has been rescheduled from 5:15 p.m. to 5:30 p.m.**

Failure to appear at this hearing will result in automatic confirmation of the existing order that your dog, Joker is a "prohibited dangerous animal" under the provisions of the Wausau Municipal Code.

Enclosed with this letter are certain documents which will be considered by the Public Health & Safety Committee as follows:

1. A copy of your appeal letters for review of the Declaration of Prohibited Dangerous Animal (email to the City Clerk with accompanying letter to the Public Health & Safety Committee dated November 3, 2017, and email to Tara Alfonso dated November 7, 2017, with accompanying revised appeal letter dated November 8, 2017, to the Public Health & Safety Committee.
2. Copy of the Prohibited Dangerous Dog Declaration addressed to original dog owner, Danielle Calhoun concerning Joker dated October 31, 2017, and served by email that same day.
3. Copy of an email from Danielle Calhoun to Ashlee Bishop, Humane Officer transferring custody of Joker to Lori Pomeroy.
4. A redacted copy of Incident Report #17-12770 dated October 29, 2017, together with Supplement Number 1 concerning the attack occurring on October 29, 2017. .
5. Photographs of the deceased dog and of Joker and Photo Identification Form for Case No. 17-12770.

6. A copy of the Rabies Quarantine Order.
7. A copy of the ordinance pertaining to this matter: W.M.C. §8.08.200, Dangerous animals.

These documents will be reviewed at the hearing. The information redacted from the above reports includes driver's license numbers and birth dates of individuals referred to in the Incident Reports.

While this matter is described as a "hearing," it will be conducted in an informal nature. The primary requirement on you at this hearing is that you will only be allowed to present information that is relevant to the alleged attack by Joker on the other dog within the city limits and the declaration concerning Joker as a prohibited dangerous dog, such as whether Joker may have been provoked or similar issues. You may bring witnesses with you to the hearing, as long as they have relevant evidence concerning the alleged attack. Please note that matters that would not be considered relevant include testimony that the dog is generally "good;" that since the incident the animal has been trained or gone to animal behavior class; or, that the animal is a little jumpy around other people or in otherwise normal situations. You may choose to be represented by an attorney at the hearing if you desire.

The City will have the Chief of Police, or his designee, present at the hearing, along with Humane Officer Ashlee Bishop and Officer Shawn Meyer, one of the two officers who investigated this matter, to provide information about the investigation and the decision finding Joker to be a prohibited dangerous animal.

The Public Health & Safety Committee has the final authority in all matters related to this hearing. This means that the Chair of the Public Health & Safety Committee will be able to determine what is relevant by ending testimony and/or excluding testimony. The Public Health & Safety Committee may base their final decision upon the credibility of witnesses.

One (1) hour has been reserved for your hearing. Additional time may be allowed upon request and at the sole discretion of the Public Health & Safety Committee. After this hearing, a written determination regarding Joker's status will be provided to you.
