Minutes of previous meetings. (12/16/19)

Motion by McElhane, second by Herbst to approve the minutes of the previous meeting on 12/16/19. Motion carried 3-0.

Consider approval or denial of various license applications

Rasmussen stated there were two Operator License applications that were recommended for denial for Chad Duwe and Brianna Kriesel. It was noted that neither applicants was present to address the committee.

Motion by McElhane, second by Herbst to approve or deny license applications as recommended by staff. Motion carried 3-0.

**It was subsequently determined after this meeting that the criminal record submitted for Brianna Kriesel indicating a 2nd OWI conviction was the wrong record belonging to another individual. Based on the corrected record Chief Bliven changed his recommendation from denial to approval for Brianna Kriesel.*

Operations Report from Fire Department for December 2019

Deputy Chief Barteck reported a couple of fires resulted in two red bulbs on our Keep the Wreath Green Program, for a total of three over that period. He noted their best record was zero and their worst was eight.

Tavern Activities / Compliance Checks / Law Enforcement Activities

Chief Bliven presented the Tavern Report for December 1, 2019 through December 31, 2019 (*See attached*).

Chief Bliven stated he and Lt. Todd Baeten had a meeting with Richard Gordon, owner of M & R Station, at which he was initially pretty confrontational, but eventually relented somewhat. Bliven explained expectations were set and they offered to have PD staff come in and work with Gordon's staff, but the offer was declined. Bliven stated Gordon was adamant there isn't an issue at his bar and that the issues were all at Roc's Place. Gordon also complained the police were at his bar more than at Roc's Place, however, the reports show the opposite to be true. Bliven stated Gordon has been put on notice that there is a concern with the management of his establishment.

Chief Bliven stated there was another shooting incident just outside Roc's Place a couple of weeks ago. There was a suspect identified through the bar video surveillance and they are working on apprehending him. He commented there have been a number of different associations with drugs at Roc's, specifically cocaine, ecstasy and acid at different times and numerous firearms incidents. He noted that many of these incidents were discovered by officers who while on patrol have come across fights. He was concerned there may be a more significant issue going on there with fights in which they are not calling the police. He indicated he was going to do a review to determine if demerit points may have been missed that perhaps should have been assessed.

Public Health and Safety Committee Memo

Topic: Special Event Staffing and Public Safety

Deputy Chief Barnes will be present on 02/24/2020 to discuss several different issues relating to Police staffing of special events. Specifically we will discuss the following topics:

CONCERNS:

- The growth in number and size of events and the need for police presence at those events. The specific events to be highlighted include the Wisconsin Valley Fair, 4th of July Fair, 400 Block Concerts, Rib Fest, Chalk Fest, and the Hmong Wausau Festival.
- Discussion of changes to the special events application process and the use of Emergency Management Plans.
- Parking and emergency access to events is creating emergency response concerns.
- The historical amount of police staffing at some of these type events is no longer sufficient. Additional police officers are necessary if we are to be prepared for emergency situations.
- The use of CSOs at special events positively impacts the events and safety, but does not eliminate the need for additional officers.
- We have experienced a reduction in the amount of Emergency Police Officers available.
- The Wausau PD may not have enough officers to appropriately staff all the special events.
- The Wausau Police Department funding source for officer overtime at special events (BEAT Grant) has been eliminated. The current police budget does not allow for funding of overtime for the quantity of officer overtime needed to staff our special events.

RECOMMENDATIONS/POSSIBLE SOLUTIONS:

- **Require the submission of an Emergency Management Plan for all special events of a certain size.**
- **Require appropriate police staffing at all special events of a certain size.**
- **Increase the CSO budget to allow for additional hires and hours. Historically we have hired a staff of summer CSOs of approximately 12. Increasing the budget to allow for the expansion of the staff to 20 CSOs would allow the Wausau PD to backfill traffic control positions not filled by Emergency Police and provide a more robust WPD presence at events. Although not related to special events, an increased CSO staff would allow for increased duties, including regular patrol of the River Walk, City of Wausau Parks, and parking structures. (Estimated \$20,000 - \$25,000 in wages and \$2,000 in additional operating expenses)**
- **Fund the hiring of two part time summer Police Officers to serve as trainers and mentors and officers working directly with the CSO staff. As we continue to raise our expectations of the CSO staff, we recognize a need to have oversight and mentoring available to them. Currently we struggle to provide sufficient supervision. Two additional officers would allow for staffing officers at events without negatively impacting our primary patrol duties. We would recruit retired officers with a desire to lead and mentor CSOs, while possessing a careers worth of institutional law enforcement knowledge. (Estimated cost \$30,000 to \$35,000)**
- **Contract with other Law Enforcement Agencies for additional police staff when needed.**

If the City Council agrees to the need for police staffing at special events, how should it be funded?


