## Minutes from the January 8, 2018 Meeting

1. Christine Martens, a volunteer at the Marathon County Historical Society, spoke to us about the organization and provided numerous brochures from them. They have multiple facilities, including:

- The Yawkey House Museum and gardens (southeast corner of 5<sup>th</sup> and McIndoe) are open to the public and was recently renovated. The Museum is open Tuesday-Sunday with tours on the hour (age-based fee applies to non-members); the gardens are always open (no fee).
- The Woodson History Center (northeast corner of 5<sup>th</sup> and McIndoe) is open to the public and was also recently renovated. They are open Tuesday-Sunday (no fee) with a research library open Tuesday-Friday and the 1<sup>st</sup> Sunday of each month. The History Center includes 3 exhibit spaces: permanent, rotating and dairy (opening in Spring, 2018).
- The former Jabronski Museum is used for storage and is closed to the public.
- The Historical Society also owns the land East Towne Community Garden is on.
- The Historical Society works with the Marathon County Parks Department by holding tours, etc., at the Little Red School House in Marathon Park.

The Historical Society has annual events, including:

- Annual Victorian Valentines Tea (February 8; reservations required; fee applies)
- Mother and Child Tea (February 10; reservations required; fee applies)
- American Girl Themed Garden Party (June 2; reservations required; fee applies)
- Slice of Marathon County Tour (September; details to follow; fee applies)
- Christmas At The Houses (12/1; fee applies)

They have monthly events as well:

- History Speaks talks at the Woodson House (at least once per month)
- Vintage Board Game Nights (4<sup>th</sup> Friday of each month)
- Bring Your Own Book group (2<sup>nd</sup> Wednesday of each month)
- Civil War Book Club (4<sup>th</sup> Thursday of each month; January- April)
- Vintage Games 21+ Nights (1<sup>st</sup> Thursday of each month at Limerick's Public House; carry-in food allowed but not beverages).

The Historical Society accepts donated items but requests you contact them before bringing the item in. They are also very interested in oral history stories from Wausau residents.

2. Officer Nate Stetzer discussed the Briefing Sheet with the group. He discussed CART (Crisis Assessment Response Team), which became effective 1/1/18 and includes 2 officers (a Wausau Police Department officer and a Marathon County Deputy). It is responsible for the entire county and is paired with someone from North Central Health Care Center. Officer Stetzer advised that Officer Meyer will be replaced by Officer Chittum as our Community Resource Officer (CRO).
