Minutes from the March 5, 2018 Meeting

1. Jeff Morgan, the current President of the Man of Honor Society spoke to our group.
 - The organization began in May 2004 and currently has around 440 members (up to 10% can be non-veterans). They are a 501(c)3 and have no dues; or restrictions on when or where the veteran served. There are no attendance requirements; meetings are held on the 2nd Saturday of every other month (beginning in January) at the Jaycees building (1425 Townline Road); food is served and a 50/50 raffle is held at the end of each meeting. In order to join Man of Honor, you must attend a meeting, complete the application and provide a copy of your DD-214 (with an honorable discharge). You then receive a challenge coin, hat and a copy of the by-laws and the most recent newsletter.
 - Man of Honor's primary source of income is their annual June raffle. A limited number of tickets are sold (at \$50 per ticket). Prizes are: 2018 Jeep Cherokee Latitude, 2018 Harley Softail Street Bob, Honda 4-wheeler with 6' X 10' trailer, John Deere 42" riding lawn mower, and cash prizes for a total value of over \$50,000.
 - The Man of Honor primarily serves Marathon County (it does include members in surrounding counties) and is not part of a national group. They were the first contributor to the Never Forgotten Honor Flight; give out approximately 10 scholarships each year; provide financial assistance for deployed service members; and help fund service dogs, car repairs and/or cancer drugs. They hold an annual ham giveaway on the Saturday closest to Pearl Harbor Day; in 2017 they provided more than 700 hams to veterans who showed a copy of their DD-214 (discharge papers).

2. Officer Jake Chittum discussed the Briefing Sheet and answered questions from the group.
 - Drugs can be brought to the Wausau area from Milwaukee/Chicago (heroin) and the Twin Cities (meth).

 - If cars are parked on both sides of the street and causing traffic issues, call the Wausau Police Department to report the situation.
3. Romey answered a question regarding snow removal. Residents have 48 hours after a storm to make an attempt to clear snow and/or ice from sidewalks.


We have an election coming up and it is important to get to the polls and voice your opinion. You have good choices for the City Council. Please also consider me a good choice to represent you on the County Board.
