

Minutes from the July 2, 2018 Meeting

A variety of topics were discussed at the meeting:

- Anne has spoken with Officer Nate Stetzer about “children at play” signs by the Tot Lot
- Anne received complaints about a house in the 800 block of Single
- We discussed the City rental inspection regulation that was nullified by the State Legislature
- A small white dog was running loose on Prospect; you can call Animal Control to report this
- A door to door solicitation asking if children lived in the home was reported; a resident advised the person was selling children’s books
- The railroad tracks on Townline, Prospect and McIntosh need work; Canadian Northern is supposed to work with the City on the problem but results seem to be limited
- Townline Road from Grand Avenue to the top of the hill is scheduled for resurfacing in 2019; Wausau is responsible for its maintenance from Grand Avenue to County Road X

Officer Nate Stetzer discussed the Briefing Sheet. He explained the City has adopted the state law for obtaining a fireworks (pyrotechnics) permit as well as which fireworks are legal within City limits. The problem with car windows being smashed was discussed park in a well-lit area (if possible), keep an eye on your vehicle and call the Police Department if you see something suspicious. Nate also discussed the Crisis Response Team (CRT), which works with North Central Health Care and is utilized daily to perform follow-ups, attempted suicides, etc.
