Minutes from the August 5, 2019 Meeting

1. City Inspectors Travis Lepinski and Adam Malzahn spoke to us about City codes and the Inspections Department.
 - Any requested changes you have for the City inspection codes should be submitted through your alderperson.
 - The City currently has proposed changes to some zoning ordinances; the revisions will be open to public comment (hopefully within the next few months).
 - You can contact the Inspections Department (confidentially) to report grass that is too long or walks that need to be shoveled.
 - The Inspections Department only has jurisdiction on the property itself; they have no control over vehicles parked on the street or on cars that haven't moved in weeks.
 - In response to a resident's question, no permit is needed if a small fence is erected as landscaping (i.e., to mark a corner).
 - There is a process that is followed when a complaint is received: a warning is issued (the time frame to correct the problem depends on the type of complaint); a daily fine may be assessed; and finally, a summons complaint/judgment may be issued. Common complaints include: grass that is too long (over 12" high); overfilled trash bins (the lid must be closed in order for it to be picked up) or trash bins not moved back out of sight within the appropriate time-frame; large items left curbside for pick-up.

- Metal roofs require special approval; exposed seam metal roofs aren't allowed at all; standing seam roofs are acceptable (as are metal roofs that look like shingles, tile, slate, etc.) as long as the appropriate approval is received.
2. When asked about the type of road surface for Townline Road, Alderperson Martens responded to that it will be blacktop.
